The League of Gentlefellows (LOG)

The League of Gentlefellows, encompassing the regions of Tasmania, is an informal social group of people who meet in non-threatening and safe environments to celebrate their lives, hold special events, share time & each other's company, develop new friendships or simply share a meal together.

LOG also has a strong associate membership base of family, friends, and LGBTI people who share in a variety of open functions. When meeting in this context, the League, out of respect, is known as the League of Gentlefellows.

The LOG membership list is discreet, ensures confidentiality and allows us to invite the many members of all ages to social events by post or email. There are no membership fees.

Normally around 30 to 60 people attend our social functions, so it's easy to get lost in the group if you want to. On special occasions such as the Rainbow Awards, we invite friends and family members to join us.

We also take advantage of our social functions to raise funds for the Coming Out Proud Trust.
